The OMP40-2 is supplied with two non-rechargeable ½AA lithiumthionyl chloride batteries: Refer to the OMP40-2 optical machine probe installation guide (Renishaw part no. H-4071-8504). Lithium batteries must be approved to BS EN 62133:2013 (IEC 62133:2012). Once the charge in the batteries is depleted, do not attempt to recharge them.
